It has been a chequered career for me. After finishing from IBA, PU, my first serious employment was with PIA, MIS Department. It was a tremendous learning experience because I got to work with Golitely & Company, airline consultants from New York, who were developing a computer-based MIS for PIA. This was the time of IBM main frame computers and well before personal computers or smart phones. Those were the good days for PIA under Air Marshall Nur Khan's dynamic leadership. I resigned in Dec

1977 and spent the next 2 years at Texas Tech University in their Management Information Systems program leading to an MSBA degree. I returned in 1980 and spent the next 3 years with Glaxo, managing their Computer Department. Another wonderful learning experience. I left Glaxo to organise my own computer software house and consultancy. My major project, which I completed in a year, was computerization of the Karachi Board of Secondary Education and really enjoyed it. During the period of my consultancy, I taught part-time at NIPA Karachi. Teaching has been the most enjoyable activity in my professional life.



Life took a huge turn when I left my profession which I loved and joined with my brother who is based in Texas, to manufacture wood and metal furnishings in Karachi and export them to USA. I have been doing that for over 4 decades now and with the Grace of Allah, still at it full time. In 1990 I had shifted the business to Islamabad.

Life teaches you a lot and there are countless lessons. But, for now, I want to share just two from personal experience.

ECONOMIC ROUNDUP

SHAHID HASSAN (1972-74)

Pakistan's Key Challenges: Security, Divisive Polity, Economy, Environment, Social Welfare and Population

We are standing at a critical juncture in country's political and economic history. The choices and decisions made today would have lasting implications for country's security, politics, governance, economy, environment, peoples' welfare and population in general. Therefore, we should realize that our actions today would have far reaching implications for country.

Political Polarization Hinders

Democratic Progress

In my view the key challenges confronting Pakistan are the following, and which should engage our attention in our conversations.

Security: First, we are facing a host of security challenges both internally and regionally. After nearly a decade long peace in the country, we see the specter of terrorism rearing its ugly head again. There is a perceptible spike in terror related incidents, including suicide bombings. Also, the incidence of law & order related crimes such as dacoities, murders, rapes, kidnappings, land grabbing, car lifting and phone snatching, is also on the rise. Besides the impinging on governance, such incidents undermine business confidence and damage investment climate. Furthermore, our region is

surrounded by numerous conflicts having implications for our national security. Our region has been facing instability for many decades, however, the amplification of this instability at present is unprecedented.

Divisive Polity: We see that there are serious divisions among the political forces and the establishment which don't augur well for the much needed stability that was hoped after the elections. There has to a dialogue among the political forces and they should have the ability to iron out their differences in the spirit of understanding, amity and give-and-take, the very essence of democratic polity. The Establishment should abstain from interfering in the political arena.

Economy: Third, and perhaps, of greatest concern, is the challenge of the economy. We are afflicted by a set of multiple challenges on the economic front, which are briefly described below:

Inflation, High
Interest Rates, and
Stagnant Growth
Challenge Economic
Stability

- Inflation is not only high but the highest and longest running in country's history;
- This is happening when for nearly a decade economic growth (GDP) has either been anemic or stagnant. Taken together, these two features pose existential threats to our economy;
- 3. Yet another consequence of this is the unprecedented level of **interest rate** which is now as high as 22% for nearly a year. At such rates survival of existing industries is at stake what to talk about new investments;
- 4. The ferocious government demand for **borrowings** is unaffected by rising interest rate thus the commercial banks are left with little room to give credit to the private sector;
- 5. For more than five years, **Fiscal deficit** is in the range of 7-8%, which is again unprecedented:
- 6. The external sector is nearly marginalized by massive restrictions on imports to conserve the precarious **level of foreign reserves**.
- 7. The exchange rate suffered massive devaluation in early 2022-23 but the Caretaker Government succeeded to some extend in bringing it to a stable level;
- 8. In the wake of such development, there are **limited investments**, falling **per capita income**, rising **unemployment** and worsening **poverty**.
- 9. While a multitude of adverse external factors have contributed significantly to such outcomes, our own policy failures, political instability and declining standards of governance are no less responsible.

Given the above precarious and untenable picture of the economy, we have to make a radical break from the policies of the recent past so that we provide a solid and sustainable foundation to economic revival and resumption of stalled growth. If we continue to depend on hand-outs from IMF, WB and other donors, our conditions would remain pathetic.

Environment: Fourth, Pakistan is facing unprecedented challenges on the environment front. This last decade has witnessed numerous disasters brought about by non-seasonal and heavy rains, ris-

ing temperatures, changing seasonal patterns, frequent occurrences of natural disasters and consequent and accelerated economic losses. It is universally recognized that Pakistan is among the leading victims of climate change globally, without making any significant contribution to environmental degradation or emission of green-house gases. Yet, in more recent episodes of such disasters Pakistan has not received the kind of support it deserved or promised on the occasion of international meetings. While we would continue to press our

narrative on world forums, a more desirable course would be to create mass awareness about the environmental challenges and encourage people to adopt environmental friendly habits and consciously adopt practices such as removal of plastics, tree plantation and protecting trees from treecutting mafias, and also move toward green energy.

Social Welfare: Fifth, it is natural to be concerned about the social welfare of weak and indigent segments of population as rising unemployment and declining per capita income would be swelling their ranks. BISP is the flagship program of social safety-net and needs strengthening. But there is evidence that there is considerable duplication between federal and provincial governments in implementing various programs of social safety-nets. It is imperative that limited resources devoted for such purposes are effectively utilized to ensure their access to the deserving recipients. BISP should be the super-highway over which every single social safety-net program should be run and only those people should be eligible for public support who are registered in the BISP data, based as it is on the census of economic and social status of population.

Strengthening Social Safety Nets Amid Rising Unemployment and Poverty

Population: Finally, the most daunting task the country is facing is population growth. The population growth rate during the period 1998-2017 was 2.4%, among the highest in the world. In the follow -up census announced in January 2024 the population growth was registered at 2.55, which is even more worrying. With such unbridled growth in population the per capita availability of water and food is declining which would lead to social unrest and other societal ills. Population welfare has receded in importance on the agenda of successive governments at least since the turn of the century. It is imperative that we give top priority to this subject and raise the awareness of our people to engage in family planning from the point of view mother-child health and family's welfare.



Key Challenges to the Pakistan's Economy:

- 1. **Security Challenges**: Internal and regional security threats, including terrorism and rising crime rates.
- 2. **Political Divisions**: Serious divisions among political forces and the establishment, impacting stability and governance.
- 3. **Economic Struggles**: High inflation, stagnant economic growth, high interest rates, fiscal deficit, and reliance on external financial support.
- 4. **Environmental Issues**: The impact of climate change, frequent natural disasters, and the need for environmental awareness and green practices.
- 5. **Social Welfare Concerns**: The necessity of strengthening social safety nets like BISP to support vulnerable populations.
- 6. **Population Growth**: The high population growth rate and its implications for resources, social welfare, and economic stability.

ON THE FRONT FOOT

KHAQAN IBRAHIM (1972-74)

The Establishment of Plaksha University and Why Our Universities Have a Bad Reputation

In 2021, India's first and largest "entrepreneurial university" was established. In 2015, 45 prominent business minds in India came together and realized that if they didn't invest in human resources today, both their country and businesses would be doomed tomorrow.

These business people initiated the best investment of their lives and laid the foundation of "Plaksha" University with an investment of two thousand crore rupees. The task of the students at this university is not to seek jobs but to start new and innovative businesses. The founders aim to have at least ten thousand new startups across India by 2031, initiated by the talented students of Plaksha University.

They want to eliminate the traditional education system that prepares young people for servitude and employment. Around the world, even in MBA programs, it is taught how to better serve others, but the education system is silent on how to run and succeed in one's own business.

"Fostering a mindset of innovation and ideas"

These 45 CEOs have decided to bring the world's best minds to this university. They have made agreements with MIT, Berkeley, Pennsylvania, and Purdue universities. Additionally, Google and IBM will provide IT support to Plaksha. After Narendra Modi's "Digital India" campaign in 2014, there has been a significant increase in the number of people thinking about this across India. India is one of the top countries for young and numerous new businesses and startups.

In 1985, Bhavish Aggarwal started a taxi service called "Ola." Bhavish doesn't own a single car, yet his system includes over a million cars operating in 169 Indian cities. In comparison, a company like Uber is limited to only 38 cities. The Delhi government,

under the Aam Aadmi Party, provided easy loans to high school students, and these students have amazed the world by running successful startups.

At the age of 18, Ritesh Aggarwal started a hotel chain named "Oyo" in partnership. Today, with 33,000 rooms in 500 cities across 12 countries, Oyo surpasses any major hotel chain in the world. India is becoming an investor's paradise day by day.

From traditional education to innovative startups

Unfortunately, our education system is creating three types of mindsets. The first mindset is that of those who study to make a living. These people are preparing for "ordinary income" and are being readied for a 9-to-5 job. They have no connection with their abilities, immense qualities, or potential. They live in the hope of getting a job and survive for servitude.

The second mindset is being prepared for "portfolio income." These individuals want to print money by becoming doctors, sell their services as lawyers, or set up a shop to sell something. The third type of mindset is being prepared for money. These individuals want to earn and live off money. They buy building after building and land after land, and thus enjoy a "luxury life" from home. If these three things are done in a legitimate and lawful manner, there is no harm in them. But my topic and subject are none of these three mindsets.

The fourth type of mindset, which our education system, our parents, our teachers, and our society are all unaware of, is the mindset of "ideas." Fortunately, Indian businessmen have taken up the task of developing this fourth mindset.

These are social entrepreneurs. These are people like Abdul Sattar Edhi, Dr. Amjad Ali Saqib, and Dr. Abdul Bari, who consider the pain of society their own pain and the suffering of the nation their own suffering. These are people like Bill Gates, Mark Zuckerberg, and Steve Jobs, who touch the aching nerves of society. All these individuals belong to the fourth mindset. They work on "ideas," chase "ideas" instead of money, and use their abilities to their fullest potential, creating ease and happiness in people's lives.

Will we ever take steps in this direction?




